Bill and Melinda Gates are sponsoring a contest to pick the best social action project designed and carried out by adolescents. You and your group will make a **formal** presentation about your project and why it should be picked. You must select a Spanish speaking country and research a current global challenge in that community. You will then come up with a solution to that problem. Your presentation should include information based on the following questions:

- 1. **Who?** Who or what group of people will be affected by your project? Who is needed to help? Who will be organizing?
- 2. What? What your project entails? What resources are needed? What impact will your project have on the community and/or the people it's meant to support?
- 3. When? When are people needed for your project and for how long? When can the community start being involved?
- 4. **Where?** Where does the project take place and where are the headquarters based? Where can information be found?
- 5. **Why?** Why will this project be important? Why should it be considered the best project?
- 6. **How?** How will this project benefit the community? How will this project be carried out (steps)? How will you get funding? How will you sustain involvement after the initial event? How will you recruit volunteers? How will you advertise your event?

Keep in mind what makes a good presentation. You should include visual aids to guide understanding of the project and make it more appealing. It should be organized and well thought out. Presenters should always be aware of who their audience is and use a register that is appropriate. Although the global challenge that you choose needs to be a current, research-based problem, your solution can be totally creative. Think outside the box!

Presentation Day

Tuesday, October 1st

This project will be worth 100 points and be based on the following rubric.

/20 Time: The **minimum** requirement is 2 minutes per student for 14/20 points. For a score of 20 in this category, groups should aim for 3 minutes per student.

/20 Fluidity: The best way to assure full credit in this category is to practice, practice, practice. The presentation should flow from one student to another and each person should be confident in their lines. The presentation is well organized and the various components of the presentation flow. Remember to use introductions and appropriate transitions between each presenter in your group.

/20 Grammar: Since you will not be able to read your lines, we are not expecting your grammar to be perfect. The expectation is that you have command of simple grammatical tenses such as the present, present progressive, preterite and imperfect. Use commands when possible to urge people to help your cause. Since this is a **formal** presentation you are required to use formal pronouns and conjugations that agree with those pronouns.

/20 Delivery: You should speak loudly and clearly. Although we do not expect you to sound like a native speaker, we do expect that your accent reflects the fact that you have been studying Spanish now for more than 2 years.

20 Overall Presentation: How well do you incorporate all the criteria listed in the project description? Is your presentation **original and thoughtful**? Is it clear that **your intentions are to help others and be a community leader and organizer**?
